

Many people ask: Where does my membership money go?

- 1. The SLCA has property that we pay taxes on each year. The clubhouse is exempt but our acreage is not. Our Fisherman's Breakfast is our main fundraiser to help pay our tax bill.
- 2. Power for the Clubhouse. We have to have lighting for safety and rentals and we have to maintain minimal heat during the winter to keep the Center in good condition. We are trying to increase our rentals to help defray these costs.
- 3.Insurance
- 4. Maintenance on clubhouse. We rely heavily on volunteers for a lot of these projects but when necessary we do have to pay out of pocket.
- 5.Operating expenses (checking account, office supplies, coffee, tea, cocoa, toilet paper, napkins, and paper towels, etc.)

You don't always notice it but the amount of time and labor your SLCA board donates to keep our SLCA running is enormous. All of these individuals are dedicated to the lake and the betterment of our community.

We have a unique opportunity here at Summit Lake to reinstate that old phenomena that used to be called a "neighborhood!" All of our board members are passionate about having a neighborhood/community that we can all be proud of. We hope you are on the same page.

LOGGING SLCA PROPERTY


Phase 1 of selective logging on the SLCA property is proceeding to provide better use of the property and generate project funds. Timber has been cut including dead and diseased trees on the property, and the saleable timber has been hauled off. There is a pile of logs remaining that still needs to be dealt with, and attempts will be made to sell some of it locally. The remainder will be made available for firewood to SLCA members. SLCA vice president, Bart Collins, has been heading up this effort.





EXTERIOR UPGRADES

Upgrades to the parking lot are still in the works. A contract for asphalt surfacing the portion of the parking lot closest to the clubhouse has been established, which will improve parking and eliminate the constant mud holes in the parking lot near the clubhouse door. It will also provide a smooth surface for a basketball and pickleball court, and other game uses. This is will be installed soon after the Phase 1 logging work is complete. A couple of rentable RV pads for member guests are also being considered.

Summit Lake Emergency Preparedness

The Emergency Preparedness committee is being cochaired by Vaughn Hodgins and Kylie Gustafson with support from our EP professional, Duane Inglin. A date will be set for a meeting to attempt to renew interest in the Emergency Preparedness program. Residents that have come together with their Team Captains and made a plan will be asked to share their success. If little or no new interest is developed, the committee will go with the names that have volunteered previously and try to make a plan from there. Residents do not seem to be aware that we could be shut off from all services and from access to town in the event of a catastrophic event.

Kylie Gustafson has obtained some information regarding an Emergency Telephone Tree. The program is called CALLMO and the costs are based on per text or call. One person would be in charge of getting the message recorded and then it would be sent out to all residents participating in the program. It would be used for Emergencies only.

Emergency Kit Basics

- Two-week supply of bottled water
- Vacuum bottle to keep drinks hot
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Dry firewood, kindling and paper
- Candles, holders and matches
- Extra blankets or sleeping bags
- Battery-powered radio with fresh batteries
- One-week supply of non-perishable food
- Manual (non-electric) can opener
- Windup or battery-operated clock
- One-week supply of baby formula, diapers, etc., if applicable
- Also be sure you have a neighbor or someone close by that you can team up with for help.

Remember to wash your hands or use sanitizer regularly, and to cover your mouth if you cough or sneeze to contain the spread of the Coronavirus and other flu strains during this season. Keep yourself and others healthy!

Boating Safety







NO WAKE ZONE

IT'S THE LAW

It has come to the attention of the SLCA that many boaters are not abiding by the lake speed limits. Please be courteous and obey the law.

The speed limit is 5 MPH within 200 feet of any shoreline or dock at all times.

The speed limit is 5 MPH during all hours of the day between opening day of lowland fishing season and the beginning of Memorial Day weekend.

The speed limit is 5 MPH between the hours of 8:00PM or official sunset (whichever is earlier) and 11:00AM, and 45 MPH between 11AM and 8PM.

Boats exceeding 5 MPH must proceed around the lake in a counter-clockwise direction.

Non motorized boats always have the right-of-way.

Don't drink and drive — this applies to boats as much as it does to automobiles!

SPRING AT SUMMIT LAKE


This has been a strange Spring at Summit Lake, and for the nation and world as well with the world wide COVID-19 pandemic. Many folks at the lake have been hunkering down at home and only venturing out to buy groceries (and toilet paper). The lake folks have been serenading each other each evening at 7:30 by howling like coyotes. We happened to be cruising the lake on Mothers day evening, and it was interesting to hear how the howls reverberated across the water.

In spite of the pandemic, with the easing of the winter wind and rain storms April and May have brought us a beautiful spring, with its warmer temperatures and the color and beauty of blossoming trees and spring flowers. We had a spectacular Mothers day weekend, with temperatures in the mid 80's! With the end of April also comes the opening of fishing season at Summit Lake. According to the WDFW charts, trout stocking at the lake thus far included 5000 catchable fish on May 1 and May 14, and the promise of one more plants of 5000. The editor found that dock fishing was good on opening day (delayed till May 5 due to COVID-19), but has been spotty since then, with limits caught on some days, and nothing but nibbles on others. Catches ranged in size from 10 to 15 inches, and the fresh fish make for great eating.

Eagles, osprey, and ducks have been making their presence known, with the eagles perching in the nearby trees waiting for a chance at a fish, or maybe a duckling.

With the easing of the pandemic related restrictions, and the opening of general boating and all the associated water sports on the lake on Memorial day weekend, we are now looking forward to the approaching Summer season at the lake.

Memorial Day Weekend

Established as an official federal holiday in 1971, Memorial Day is a holiday that celebrates and recognizes the soldiers who have given their lives in the line of duty defending the USA. To many, there is confusion as to how the flag is to be presented on Memorial Day. So here is an excerpt that describes the proper flag etiquette for this day of remembrance.

Memorial Day Flag Protocol

Flag etiquette on Memorial Day is unique. At sunrise, flags are to be raised to full staff briskly, then lowered to half staff position where they will remain until noon to remember those who have given their lives for our country. At noon, flags are to be raised to full-staff and will be displayed there for the remainder of the holiday to honor our active military and the veterans who have served our country.



Note: President Donald Trump said Thursday that the federal government would fly flags at half-mast over Memorial Day weekend in tribute to the toll of tens of thousands of people — and mounting — who have been killed in the U.S. by the novel coronavirus pandemic. So, whether you choose to follow the federal government methods, or the normal Memorial Day etiquette, please honor this day appropriately.
