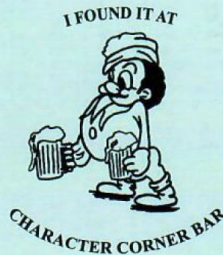

Water Quality Report

In late March, an area of blue-green algae was reported to Thurston County Health Dept. Test readings for Anatoxin-a indicated an unsafe level of this toxin in the algae scum, and the county issued a toxin alert for the lake. Subsequent weekly readings showed reduced levels of toxin, and the alert was lifted on April 25. Enjoy the Summer!

Blue-Green Algae - Summit Lake Advisory Lifted

Dear Summit Lake Residents and Users,

April 25, 2019

Lab results received today, April 25, 2019, for a sample collected on Monday, April 22, 2019 show that the toxin levels are below the reporting detection limit for anatoxin-a.

One (1) microgram per liter is considered a level for health concern. The Health Alert has been lifted as we have had two (2) consecutive weeks where samples are below the advisory level.

Water systems that use lake water should be purged prior to using the water.

Health Department will monitor the lake for toxin producing algae blooms only when residents report a new algae bloom.

Many residents around Summit Lake depend on the lake for drinking water. When there is an algae bloom present, we recommend extra precautions be taken to avoid the health risks posed by potential toxins.

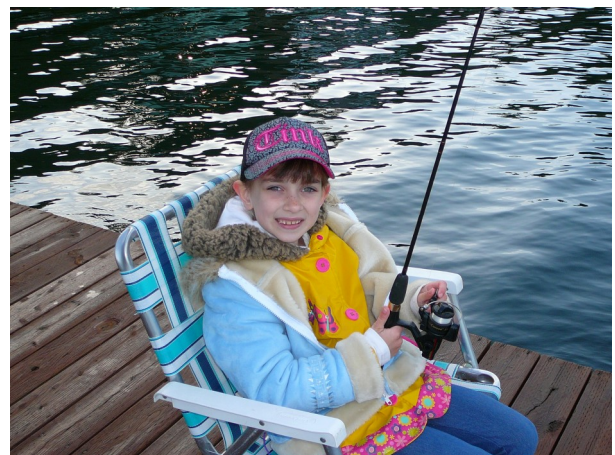

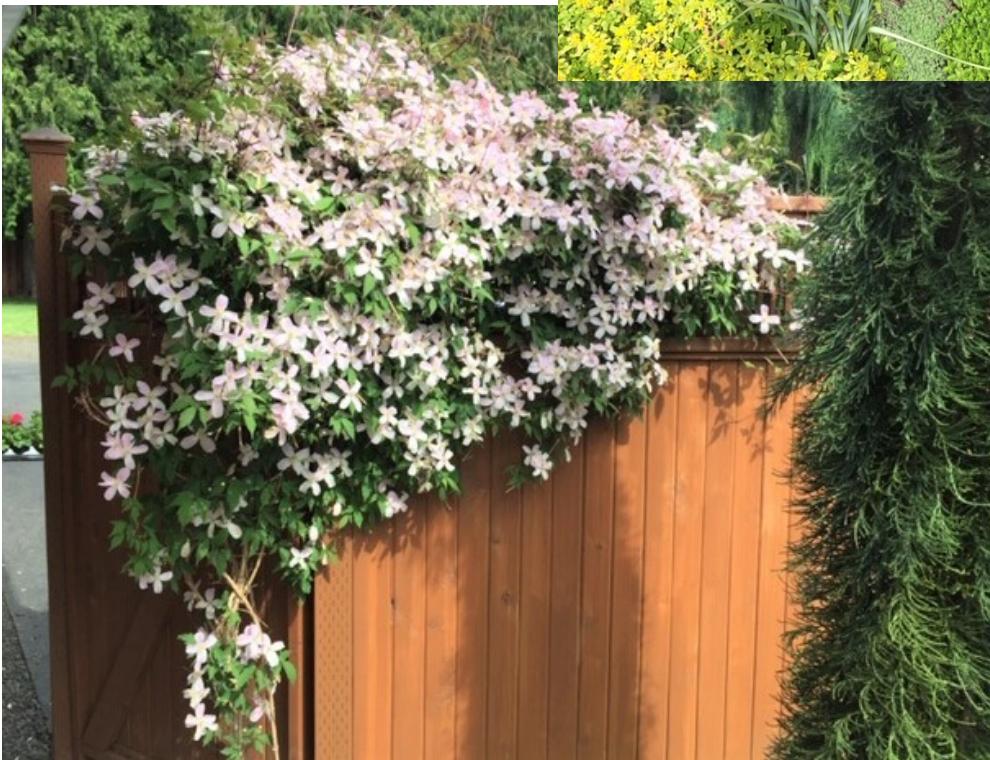
SPRING AT SUMMIT LAKE

After the January wind storms, and February snow storms inundated the area with falling branches and trees and near record snow falls, April and May has brought us a beautiful spring with its warmer temperatures and the color and beauty of blossoming trees and spring flowers. With the end of April also comes the opening of fishing season at Summit Lake. According to the WDFW charts, trout stocking at the lake thus far included 5500 catchable fish (including 500 jumbos) on April 26, and 5000 on May 6. The editor found that dock fishing was good on opening day (April 27), but has ben spotty since with limits caught on some days, and nothing but nibbles on others. Catches ranged in size from 10 to 16 inches, and the fresh fish make for great eating. We are now looking forward to Memorial day and the opening of general boating and all the associated water sports on the lake.

IT'S THE LAW



It has come to the attention of the SLCA that many boaters are not abiding by the lake speed limits. Please be courteous and obey the law.

The speed limit is 5 MPH within 200 feet of any shoreline or dock at all times.

The speed limit is 5 MPH during all hours of the day between opening day of lowland fishing season and the beginning of Memorial Day weekend.

The speed limit is 5 MPH between the hours of 8:00PM or official sunset (whichever is earlier) and 11:00AM, and 45 MPH between 11AM and 8PM.

Boats exceeding 5 MPH must proceed around the lake in a counter-clockwise direction.

Non motorized boats always have the right-of-way.

Don't drink and drive — this applies to boats as much as it does to automobiles!

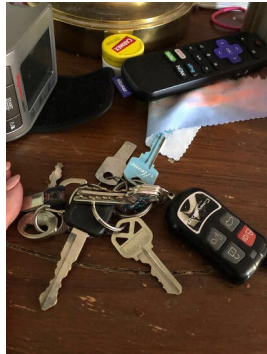

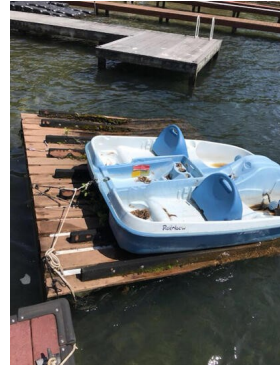
