

SLCA GENERAL MEETING MINUTES FRIDAY, JANUARY 17, 2019

Meeting was called to order at 7:05 by Craig Edwards. All Board Members were present except for Richelle Gonzales. **Pledge of Allegiance**

Treasurers Report -Ronni Collins

- Recap of 2019 see attached Report
- Treasurers Report were approved and accepted. Motions were made by Vaughn and Terry.

Minutes - Joni Fuchs

Minutes were approved and accepted. Motion by Vaughn and Terry.

Old Business

Phase 1 -Four Acre project Update- Craig and Bart

- Paving will be done in the Spring when the weather is more suitable.
- Counters and Dishwasher are in the process of being installed. Two double sinks and their faucets were donated from Haloday -Parks. Thank you, Bart Collins.
- Painting Retouch will be done as soon as kitchen work is completed.
- Logging will start soon. Lumber prices are up. The Membership was asked to approve 8 loads coming out since we
 missed our chance from last year. The Board will look at the property after four loads and determine if we need to
 halt. The logger will burn all the brush piles. Terry Brannberg moved we do eight loads in 2020 and the second was
 made by Vaughn Hodgins. The diseased and dead trees will be put in a pile and offered to the Community for firewood. We will also notify the Community a time when they can remove native plants if they want to.

Hot Spot for Clubhouse- Dwayne Swenson

Last night's meeting was the first time we have had internet at the Clubhouse. Dwayne Swenson has donated the
equipment we need. The Internet bill will be paid year to Dwayne Swenson. The cost is \$30.00 a month. Thanks
Dwayne Swenson.

New Business

Rental Increase for Hall

- Proposed Increase- It was suggested the cost for Rental from Members be raised to \$150. It will still remain \$250 to none Members. This will help offset the Internet costs.
- \$300 Returnable Damage Deposit will be required.
- Hall Rental Agreement is in the process of being updated.

Letters from Zabrinski and Hart -On Stocking

 The Board decided to not get involved in this debate and leave it to the Community. Approximately 200 letters were received by WDFW. Over 200 letters were supporting the stocking. Duane is talking to WDFW to get some Jumbos planted this year.

Road Safety

- Brad Bastin has been working with the County and the Sheriffs office on this problem. Neither office will do anything
 without a formal request from the Commissioners. Brad has made this request and our issues will be studied. Thank
 you Brad for all your hard work on this issue.
- Craig Fuchs brought up the need for Pedestrians to also wear reflective clothing at night as they are so hard to see when dressed in dark clothing.
- \$4684.58 worth of Summit Lake Bling was sold in 2019.

- Membership was asked for their thoughts. It was determined they would like to have a fish added on the Logo. They
 would like Olympia WA. to be bigger and easier to read. hey also suggested adding a kayaker and Paddle Boarder.
 Most humorous suggestion was adding a "SPEED LIMIT SIGN!" It was asked if our current logo could be done in
 the design of a fish instead of an oval.
- Vaughn said it would be nice if the Summit Lake Bling included reflective safety wear for walkers and runners, and cyclists. Joni will address this in her next order
- A motion allowing \$4K to be allowed for purchase of replenishing the merchandise before the Fisherman's Breakfast was passed. We get better discounts when ordering in bulk instead of Special Orders throughout the year. \$4684.58 worth of Summit Lake Bling was sold in 2019.

Lake Water Level-

• The Hydraulic Permit for the placement of the Boards at the end of the Lake is up in April of 2020. Charlie Collins is still doing the placement of the Board. WDFW is monitoring the water level also.

Fisherman's Breakfast- Duane Inglin

- Duane is working on a "Kids only Summit Lake Fishing Derby" for Opening Day. It will be for kids 14 and under. The \$5.00 Derby ticket will also get them a free breakfast on Opening Day at the Clubhouse.
- Dwayne Swenson and Duane Inglin are currently looking for prizes and donations.
- For people without a boat, there was a discussion about lake front owners sharing their dock for a few hours. Duane will be look into the feasibility of this idea more thoroughly.
- WDFW is on Board and supporting the promotion of this Derby.
- There will be a 5 fish limit.
- Licenses not requited under 14
- All kids required to have PFD's.
- Duane working on getting more Jumbos put in the late for Opening Day.
- If you are interested in volunteering to help with this Event please let SLCA or Duane Inglin know.

ICE CREAM SOCIAL/POTLUCK

- Judy Swenson brought up the idea of the Ice Cream Social scheduled for the March Annual Meeting be swapped with the Potluck at the June Meeting. It was agreed to make the change.

Emergency Preparedness-Vaughn Hodgins, Duane Inglin, Kylie Gustafsen

We need a meeting to renew interest in the program

INTERIOR UPGRADES

EXTERIOR UPGRADES

Phase 1 of selective logging on the SLCA property is proceeding to provide better use of the property and generate project funds. SLCA vice president, Bart Collins, is heading up this effort and this is expected to be accomplished within the next few weeks.

Upgrades to the parking lot are still in the works. A contract for asphalt surfacing the portion of the parking lot closest to the clubhouse has been established, which will improve parking and eliminate the constant mud holes in the parking lot near the clubhouse door. It will also provide a smooth surface for a basketball and pickleball court, and other game uses. This is expected to be installed soon after the Phase 1 logging is completed.









Summit Lake Emergency Preparedness

The Emergency Preparedness committee is being cochaired by Vaughn Hodgins and Kylie Gustafson with support from our EP professional, Duane Inglin. We need a meeting A date will be set for a meeting to attempt to renew interest in the Emergency Preparedness program. Residents that have come together with their Team Captains and made a plan will be asked to share their success. If little or no new interest is developed, the committee will go with the names that have volunteered previously and try to make a plan from there. Residents do not seem to be aware that we could be shut off from all services and from access to town in the event of a catastrophic event.

Kylie Gustafson has obtained some information regarding an Emergency Telephone Tree. The program is called CALLMO and the costs are based on per text or call. One person would be in charge of getting the message recorded and then it would be sent out to all residents participating in the program. It would be used for Emergencies only.

Emergency Kit Basics

- Two-week supply of bottled water
- Vacuum bottle to keep drinks hot
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Dry firewood, kindling and paper
- Candles, holders and matches
- Extra blankets or sleeping bags
- Battery-powered radio with fresh batteries
- One-week supply of non-perishable food
- Manual (non-electric) can opener
- Windup or battery-operated clock
- One-week supply of baby formula, diapers, etc., if applicable
- Also be sure you have a neighbor or someone close by that you can team up with for help.

Remember to wash your hands or use sanitizer regularly, and to cover your mouth if you cough or sneeze to contain the spread of the Coronavirus and other flu strains during this season. Keep yourself and others healthy!

There will be an open mike night at the clubhouse on Saturday, March 21.


This will be hosted by Mike Neff and his band in honor of Tim Nole.
