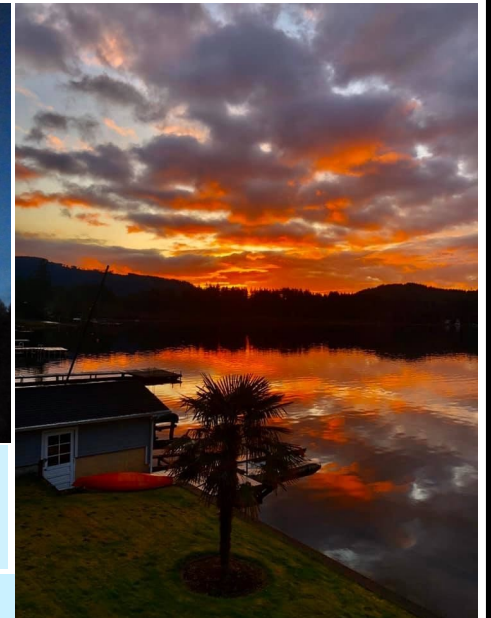

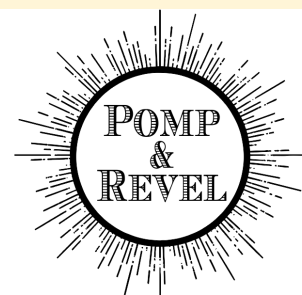
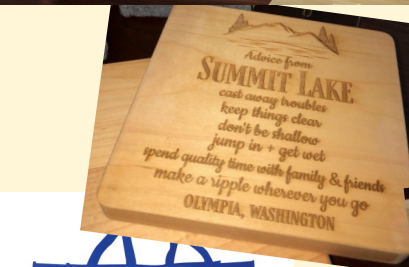

The Summit Lake Community Center is available to be rented for your events!

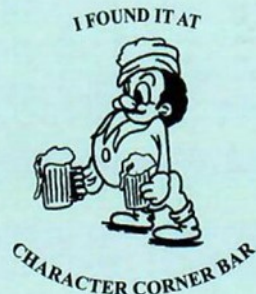

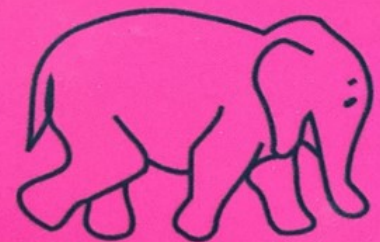

Many people ask: Where does my membership money go?

1.The SLCA has property that we pay taxes on each year. The clubhouse is exempt but our acreage is not. Our Fisherman's Breakfast is our main fundraiser to help pay our tax bill.

2.Power for the Clubhouse. We have to have lighting for safety and rentals and we have to maintain minimal heat during the winter to keep the Center in good condition. We are trying to increase our rentals to help defray these costs.

3.Insurance

4.Maintenance on clubhouse. We rely heavily on volunteers for a lot of these projects but when necessary we do have to pay out of pocket.

5.Operating expenses (checking account, office supplies , coffee, tea, cocoa, toilet paper, napkins, and paper towels, etc.)

You don't always notice it but the amount of time and labor your SLCA board donates to keep our SLCA running is enormous. All of these individuals are dedicated to the lake and the betterment of our community.

We have a unique opportunity here at Summit Lake to reinstate that old phenomena that used to be called a "neighborhood!" All of our board members are passionate about having a neighborhood/community that we can all be proud of. We hope you are on the same page.

1. **FOUR ACRE PROJECT UPDATE**-Vice President Bart Collins and President Craig Edwards

PHASE ONE 4 ACRE PARCEL

LOGGING – Logging has been completed. Vice President Collins said we were lucky to have our logger. It was done with low impact and the underbrush is already coming back. Question: Were all the dead trees removed-Dead trees and leaners were removed.

If you are interested in firewood, call Bart Collins 206-595-0385. Members will have to sign a waiver before getting the firewood. The firewood will be available for one month from tonight. After one month it will be disposed of.

PAVING – Will start next week with Pickle Ball and Basketball Courts.

2. TICKETED RAFFLE - CRAIG EDWARDS

Since SLCA was not able to have its major Fundraiser this year we are looking for feedback from the Community if they would be willing to participate in a ticketed Raffle or an online silent auction. We have some super items available to raffle off!

3. SOLAR SPEED LIGHTS

A solar speed signs are around \$3K-\$4K. SLCA is looking for input from the Community on their need and if they would actually help.

Joni will check with Brad Bastin and see if anything has happened on the county collecting our road data.

Question asked about the portable signs being use. It was noted that this had been done before but it doesn't seem to be effective and requires constant manning of the equipment.

4. FLAG PERSON STILL NEEDED- Craig asked if possibly there was a Veteran out there that would be willing to take on the task.

There is an App that is free that will remind you of when the flag is lowered to half-staff during the year. Typically, this occurs maybe 4-5 times a year.

5. CHANGING OF THE WATER RETENTION BOARDS AT THE LAKE -

Michael Patterson said that Charlie Collins had put the Boards in place as directed by WDFW.

Michael Patterson and Craig Edwards are still looking into the Contract which expired in April

NEW BUSINESS**1. MAIL THEFT AND BREAKINS -**

The Seattle Postal Attorney General is aware of our problems out here with mail theft and are looking to find a solution. COVID19 has slowed down the process.

2. COMMUNITY CENTER GATE CODE - The gate codes will be changed and a new code will be provided to all current Members.**3. LENDING LIBRARY -**

The Lending Library is doing well. The bookshelves are placed in the outside entry way of the Clubhouse. Check it out for something to read during these long COVID19 nights.

4.FISH STOCKING LEVELS – President Edwards read a report from Duane Inglin who was not able to be at the meeting.

Our stocking levels have never gone back to what they were three years ago. Craig Edwards and Kerry Hart plan to meet with the WDFW Director in the near future and discuss our stocking issues.

It appears we are still being punished for not allowing the Lake to be opened all year.

Kerry Hart went last year to meet with Larry Phillips and was told to get signatures to show the Community wanted the Lake stocked. Kerry obtained and submitted 160 signatures. Nothing has happened since.

We have received all three stockings of 50,000 fish for the year. No jumbos were planted.

If the meetings do not produce any results, President Edwards will ask Community to go to the WDFW Commissioners meeting to get our concerns addressed.

We still plan for a kid fishing derby next year sponsored by SLCA and WDFW.

5. WELCOME COMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON

Margaret Williams is our new Welcoming Committee Chair. She is realtor and long-time resident at the Lake.

Please let SLCA know about new neighbors so she can give them a Summitterian Welcome.

6. 4TH OF JULY BOAT PARADE – Dwayne Swenson will be in charge of the Parade again this year.

Summit Lake Emergency Preparedness

The Emergency Preparedness committee is being co-chaired by Vaughn Hodgins and Kylie Gustafson with support from our EP professional, Duane Inglin. We need a meeting. A date will be set for a meeting to attempt to renew interest in the Emergency Preparedness program. Residents that have come together with their Team Captains and made a plan will be asked to share their success. If little or no new interest is developed, the committee will go with the names that have volunteered previously and try to make a plan from there. Residents do not seem to be aware that we could be shut off from all services and from access to town in the event of a catastrophic event.

Remember to wash your hands or use sanitizer regularly, and to cover your mouth if you cough or sneeze to contain the spread of the Coronavirus and other flu strains during this season. Keep yourself and others healthy!

Emergency Kit Basics

- Two-week supply of bottled water
- Vacuum bottle to keep drinks hot
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Dry firewood, kindling and paper
- Candles, holders and matches
- Extra blankets or sleeping bags
- Battery-powered radio with fresh batteries
- One-week supply of non-perishable food
- Manual (non-electric) can opener
- Windup or battery-operated clock
- One-week supply of baby formula, diapers, etc., if applicable
- Also be sure you have a neighbor or someone close by that you can team up with for help.

Water Quality Report

On June 22, an area of blue-green algae was reported to Thurston County Health Dept.

An algae sample was taken at that time and tested for Anatoxin-a by the County. Test results indicated NO unsafe level of toxin in the algae scum. Subsequent sample readings the following week also showed unreadable levels of toxin. No blue-green algae has been reported on the lake since then.

Boating Safety



IT'S THE LAW

It has come to the attention of the SLCA that many boaters are not abiding by the lake speed limits. Please be courteous and obey the law.

The speed limit is 5 MPH within 200 feet of any shoreline or dock at all times.

The speed limit is 5 MPH during all hours of the day between opening day of lowland fishing season and the beginning of Memorial Day weekend.

The speed limit is 5 MPH between the hours of 8:00PM or official sunset (whichever is earlier) and 11:00AM, and 45 MPH between 11AM and 8PM.

Boats exceeding 5 MPH must proceed around the lake in a counter-clockwise direction.

Non motorized boats always have the right-of-way.

Don't drink and drive — this applies to boats as much as it does to automobiles!

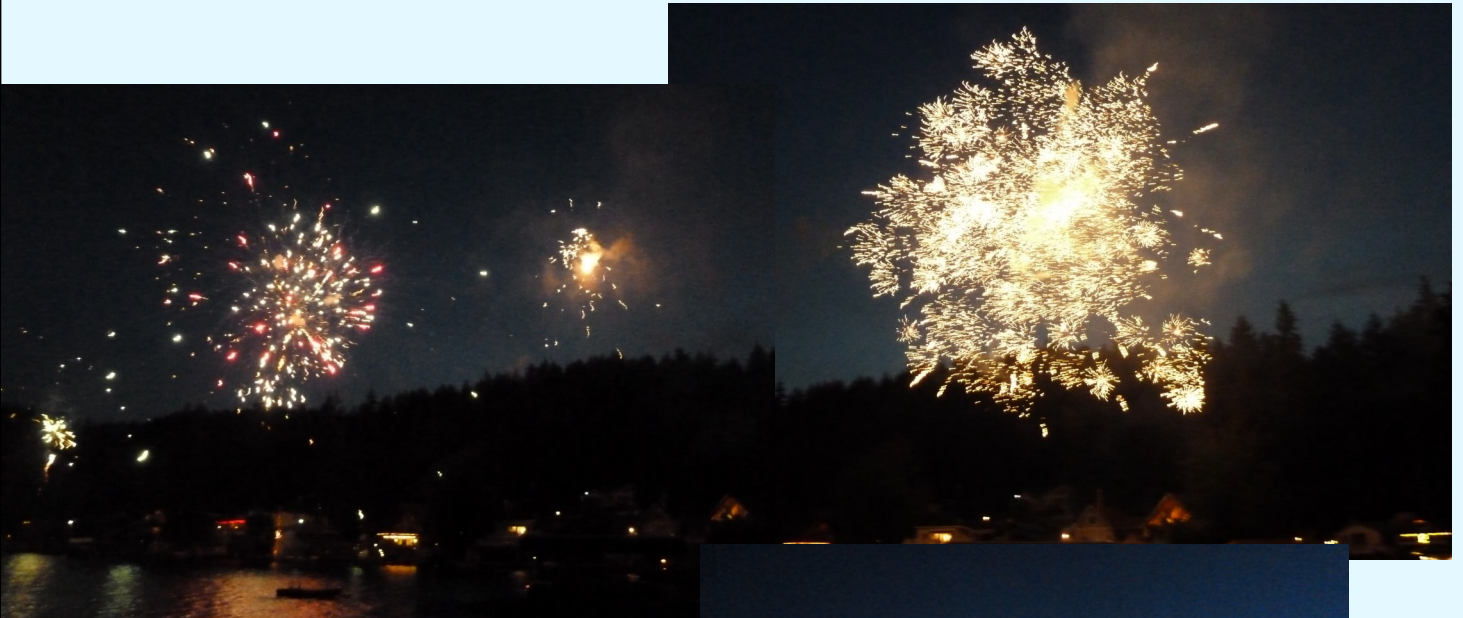

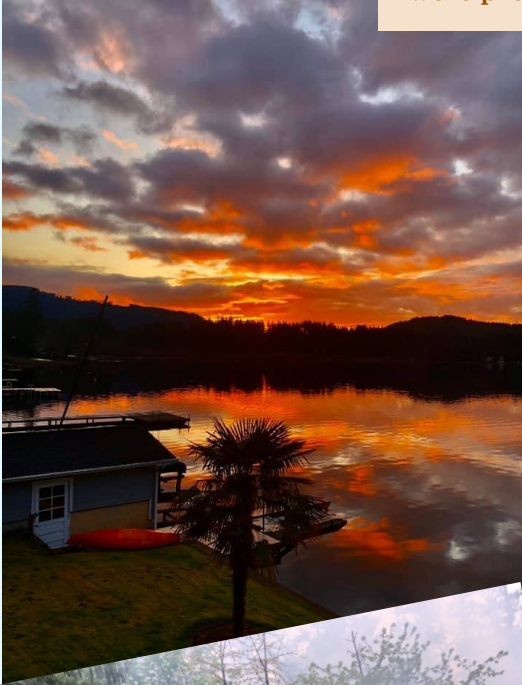

KENNEDY FALLS

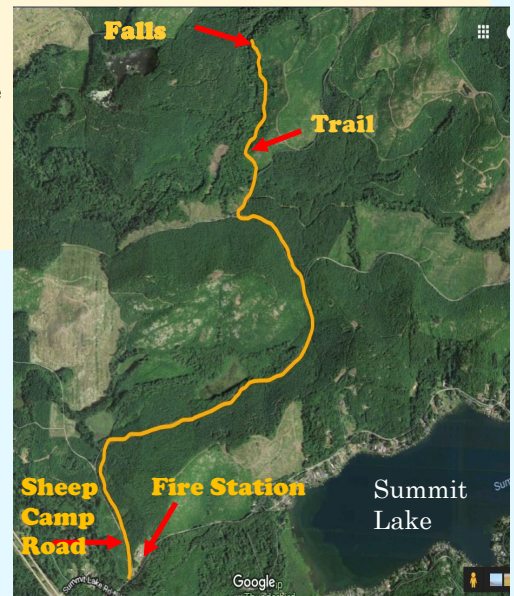
Have you made the hike to Kennedy falls? The falls are quite nice with a total drop of about 30-40 feet as shown in the adjacent picture. The way starts at Sheep Camp Road near the fire station, and except for a foot trail for the last half mile, follows logging roads on Green Diamond property. The foot trail is a bit difficult to locate as there is no sign, and it can be quite muddy in places, especially after rains. There is a steep climb down to the creek near the falls, but the best view of the falls is from the other side of the creek—it requires a bit of rock hopping to cross.

Round trip hike is about 5 miles from the gate at Sheep Camp Road. If you do the hike, be aware that this is an active logging area and there may be company vehicles or logging trucks on the logging roads. Green Diamond allows hiking and biking in the area, but no motorized vehicles.

Note: Google maps shows the logging roads and trail quite well if you zoom in enough.

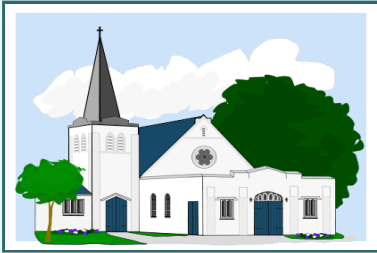

TCSO deputies responded to the Summit Lake boat ramp around 2:15pm today for a report of a found body under the water near the ramp. Members of the TCSO Dive Rescue Team were able to pull the victim from the water and he was pronounced deceased at the scene. The male was believed to have been swimming in the area, but no one saw him go underwater. There are no signs of foul play, but the exact cause of death will be determined by the TC Coroner. The deceased male was in his late 20's from the Olympia area. This was unfortunately the second drowning in Thurston County in the last few days. Please remember that our waters are still cold and to wear a life jacket or other flotation device.

According to the Olympian, the Thurston County Coroner's Office has identified the man whose body was found in Summit Lake Tuesday afternoon as Ruben Robles, 27, of Olympia.



Keep a watchful eye out for mail and package thieves!
