Thurston narcotics task force seize pot plants, cash in drug bust near Summit Lake

Hundreds of pot plants, cash and a firearm were seized by the Thurston County Narcotics Task Force after they busted up a large-scale pot growing operation near Summit Lake on Monday.

The task force seized 250 pot plants, 300 pounds of processed pot, \$110,000 in cash and a shotgun, according to a news release. A man also was taken into custody.

Acting on a tip, the task force obtained two search warrants and then carried out its investigation about 4 p.m. Monday in the 2300 block of Summit Lake Shore Road Northwest.

During the investigation they detained two people without incident. A 26-year-old man was arrested on suspicion of manufacturing a controlled substance and unlawful possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver.

October General Membership Meeting Minutes

October 5, 2019

Board Members Present: President Nole, Treasurer Patrick Patterson, Secretary Debra Martinelli, and Trustees Joni Fuchs, Duane Inglin and Tim Nole.

37 Members attended.

1. The meeting was called to order by President Nancy Nole at 6:30 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was done. A Community announcement was received indicating that Floyd Japhet has received a pace-maker and is recovering.
2. A nomination was made by Nancy Nole to install two interim officers for the remainder of 2018. Members in attendance endorsed the nominations, thereby installing Joni Fuchs as Trustee, and Debra Martinelli as Secretary.
3. The Board went into executive session to vote on the future of the clubhouse. The majority voted to retain the clubhouse.
4. Nancy Nole read minutes of the last General Membership Meeting held on June 1, 2018. One amendment was requested by Craig Edward to strike a comment attributed to him. Nancy Nole accepted the amendment. Sharon Roberts moved to accept the minutes as amended. The minutes were approved.
5. Patrick Patterson presented the Treasurers Report. Revenues were reported to be \$2565 for the past three months of which approximately \$500 was from clubhouse rentals, \$575 was from the SLCA community garage sale, \$200.43 was from the annual picnic, and the remainder was from logo sales and dues payments received. Disbursements totaled \$1461.38 for the same time period of which approximately \$900 was for landscape services and \$200 was electric bills for the clubhouse. Other disbursements were for a CPA consultation and clubhouse exit signs. Tim Nole was thanked for purchasing and installing the exit signs. The balance at the end of the three months was reported as \$14,048.09. A motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report.
6. Old Business:
 - a. Membership Report: Patrick Patterson reported he has 10 paid memberships for 2019 and 192 for 2018. Sharon Roberts was thanked for her work to bring in 31 new members. Unfortunately, 28 members from 2017 did not renew in 2018. Thirty-two members from 2016 and before have also not paid dues.
 - b. SLCA Picnic Report: Donations totaled \$189.75. Expenditures for food, supplies, and propane totaled \$268.80. The cost of the picnic born by the SLCA was \$78.09. Logo item sales at the picnic produced a net profit of \$279.48. This is the first time revenues from the annual picnic exceeded expenditures.
 - c. SLCA Yard Sale – Despite rainy weather, there were \$675.00 in proceeds generated by the sale. The garage sale was located at Gordon and Linda Darby's home and many donations were received from the Summit Lake community. Nancy Nole expressed disappointment that some garage sales held in private residences around the lake that did not pay fees associated with being part of the community garage sale.
 - d. Clubhouse decision by the SLCA Board:
 - Nancy Nole reported that the majority of the Board is in favor of retaining the clubhouse. She then highlighted the background for this decision, and discussed possible ways to fund clubhouse operation and maintenance.
 - Nancy reported that the Board further recommends a change in the SLCA Bylaws to increase dues to fund the clubhouse operating and maintenance as well as make improvements.
 - Comments from attendees showed general support to increase dues to \$60 in 2019.
 - Joni Fuchs discussed contemplated improvements needed for the Clubhouse. She stressed the need for adding Internet so that State and other government agencies would consider renting the clubhouse. She also indicated that the creation of a smaller more efficient kitchen could allow for a larger event room. Joni summarized what materials have been purchased and donated, and set forth volunteer dates for those willing to work on needed improvements.
 - Nancy Nole stated that some improvements will need to be done professionally.

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- Sharon Roberts asked if the capacity of the clubhouse could be increased. The capacity is now 100 people. Sharon said that the clubhouse is too small for some events such as weddings. Nancy Nole indicated that If capacity is based on square footage, a change in capacity is unlikely. Tim Nole said that the septic system could also be an issue with an increase in capacity.
 - Joni stated the SLCA now has purchased wedding tents to use for events.
 - Patrick Patterson clarified that the SLCA's non-profit status limits the association to 15 "revenue generating" days per year. That includes rentals, and events such as the SLCA Community Garage sale. Nancy indicated that a change in status has been investigated by the Board and it is not feasible.
 - Several attendees expressed support for fundraisers and specific requests for donation for needed major maintenance or improvements.
 - Attendees were in general agreement that an increase in dues beyond the 25% allowed in the current bylaws is needed.
 - Patrick Patterson read the section of the bylaws pertaining to changing the bylaws. Debra Martinelli read the current bylaws section pertaining to the Board's ability to increase dues not more than 25%.
 - A motion was made by Sharon Roberts and seconded to make a one time increase in the dues to \$60 for 2019.
 - Terry Brannberg made a motion to raise the annual dues to \$60.00 per year for 2019, and for 2020 and beyond to keep the bylaws language in place to allow the Board to increase dues up to 25%. The motion was seconded.
 - Nancy Nole thanked the attendees for their input and stated that there would be further discussion and a vote on an amendment to the bylaws in the next General Meeting.
- e. Emergency Preparedness: Vaughn Hodgins indicated he will assume the lead in helping to establish team captains around the lake because all who volunteered to be captains are located in a small geographic area. Duane Inglin will assist Vaughn and offered to work to facilitate needed training to orient captains in organizing themselves and their neighbors to prepare for emergencies. Nancy Nole said that she and Tim hosted neighbors on Turkey Rd for an emergency preparedness meeting. She reported a high level of success in getting neighbors to understand how they can contribute in the case of emergencies, and to share possible special needs they may have. She feels Turkey Rd neighbors are now much better prepared to help each other. Deb Martinelli and Jack Benjamin volunteered to be captains in their area of the lake.

5. New Business:

- a. The following nominations were accepted for 2019 SLCA Board Members:
President – Craig Edwards
Vice President – Bart Collins
Secretary – Debra Martinelli
Treasurer – Ronni Collins

Patrick Patterson declined his nomination to be Treasurer and Debra Martinelli did not accept her nomination but told Nancy Nole she would consider it.

Trustees Nominated included: Debbie White, Joni Fuchs, Dwayne Swenson, Jack Benjamin, Cindy Edwards. Duane Inglin indicated he is willing to continue as Trustee in 2019 to complete his 2-year term.

Voting will take place at the November 2, 2018 SLCA General Membership Meeting.

- b. Other Business: Grady Johnson, representing his parents, the Williams, commented that when his family rinses their boat off in Summit Lake after having it out in salt water they are not breaking any state rules. He offered to share the rules. Grady also clarified that the Williams are not dumping their bilge or any other tanks into Summit Lake, and they are not washing their boat in the lake. They are simply rinsing it off. Grady expressed concern over the harassment his parents were receiving from other residents for rinsing their boat. Duane Inglin said he was aware of other boaters who are scrubbing and using soap to clean their boats at the boat landing and indicated residents should step in to stop those situations from harming the lake. Nancy proposed that Grady Johnson prepare an article on this subject for the SLCA newsletter.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 PM.

November General Membership Meeting Minutes

November 16, 2018

Board Members Present: President Nancy Nole, Treasurer Patrick Patterson, Secretary Debra Martinelli, and Trustees Joni Fuchs and Duane Inglin

Twenty-seven members attended.

1. The meeting was called to order by President Nole at 6:35 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance was done.

Community Announcement: Tim Nole recently had knee surgery and is home recuperating.

2. The Minutes of the October 5, 2018 meeting were presented by Debra Martinelli. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes.

3. Patrick Patterson made the following Treasurer's Report:

The report includes activity for October and November.

The ending balance after the last General Meeting in September was \$14,048.09

Deposits for the month included \$100.00 in SLCA Garage Sale proceeds.

Disbursements included: \$13.66 in mouse baits used on the Clubhouse property; \$291.33 for landscape maintenance for October; \$564.64, for the second installment of 2018 Clubhouse property taxes; \$85.79 for property taxes on the Turkey Rd property; \$263.80 for SLCA Annual Picnic expenses; \$85.10 for the Barmuta farewell party; \$27.88 for a reorder of checks for the SLCA account; and \$112.44 for Clubhouse electricity. The new balance as of this November General Meeting is \$12,730.45.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report.

4. Old Business:

- a. Membership Report: The memberships totaled 202 for 2018.

Clubhouse decision announcement: President Nole repeated the Board's decision to retain the Clubhouse and distributed a written copy of the motion that was made and passed at the October 5th meeting. She then asked if there was any discussion. A question was raised about how the dues would be spent. Nancy indicated that the new 2019 Board will make a budget and determine how the proceeds from the dues are spent. Joni Fuchs indicated that currently only \$500 is allocated for improvements to the Clubhouse, and others on the Board indicated that the money is needed for operating expenses and maintenance of the Clubhouse. Fund raising will still be necessary, even with the increase proposed.

Terry Brannberg indicated that the motion he made at the October 5th meeting was: "Amend the SLCA Bylaws to raise the annual dues to \$60.00 per year for 2019 and, for 2020 and beyond, keep the bylaws language in place that allows the Board to increase dues up to 25% each year." The motion passed unanimously.

Sharon Roberts asked that the amended Bylaws be distributed to the membership electronically.

A suggestion was also received that those who have already paid their dues for 2019 should not have to pay the additional amount.

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c. Emergency Preparedness: Vaughn Hodgins shared a map of the lake properties and said he needs more team captains. He invited people to meet at the map so he could show them the parts of the lake that need team captains. Vaughn stressed that it is important that full time residents be team captains, attend training, and hold meetings of the neighbors in their assigned area. Vaughn volunteered to help team captains with the meetings, and Duane Inglin will coordinate training for those who missed the earlier sessions. Vaughn stressed that we need to be prepared to help ourselves, because in any large-scale disaster we could be cut-off from emergency services and we will need to fend for ourselves. Duane Inglin said we should prepare for at least 10 days of self-sufficiency. It is possible that the Clubhouse could be used as a Command Center, and the Church is set-up to provide emergency housing. We should also share who has important skills such as medical training and resources such as generators and chain saws, as well as those who may need extra help due to mobility problems or other issues.

5. New Business

a. Nominations for the 2019 SLCA Board: President Nole presented the existing nominees for each office and read the duties of each office. President Nole asked for additional nominations. She then presented the nominations as follows:

President: Craig Edwards

Vice President: Bart Collins

Secretary: Joni Fuchs

Treasurer: Ronnie Collins

Trustees (two-year terms): Dwayne Swenson, Debbie White, and Debra Martinelli

Trustee (one-year term): Cyndie Sundstrom

(Note: Duane Inglin will continue as a Trustee for one additional year.)

President Nole called for a vote of the membership. The vote was unanimous, save one.

b. Holiday Party: Joni Fuchs volunteered to coordinate the party which will be held December 15th at 6:30 PM.

c. Fish Stocking: Duane Inglin has made contact with the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) to discuss restoring fish stocking to pre-2018 levels. Previously 30,000 to 40,000 fish were stocked in Summit Lake over the course of any given year; in 2018 only 2000 were stocked, and fishing was noticeably impacted. WDFW may restore stocking at higher levels if they receive Summit Lake Community support. It was proposed that a meeting with WDFW be requested for January or February, and that an article on this subject be included in the next SLCA newsletter. Duane also indicated that he may use social media to find out if there is support from outside the Summit Lake Community.

Kerry Hart made a motion that "the SLCA Board, on behalf of the SLCA Membership, pursue communications with the Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife with the intent to have that agency resume fish stocking on Summit Lake in the Spring of 2019". The motion was seconded by Terry Brannberg (among others) and the vote was unanimous to contact the WDFW as soon as possible, preferably when the new Board meets in January.

d. Sharon Roberts suggested that the minutes of this and future meetings be sent to the SLCA membership.

e. Terry Brannberg said he needs items for the SLCA Newsletter by December 1st. Joni Fuchs suggested that the SLCA Newsletter go out to all property owners around the lake, not just SLCA members.

f. Jack Benjamin thanked all of the Board Members and Trustees for their great service this year.

6. The meeting was adjourned.

3. Once we have our 'core' captains, I will schedule a meeting for Thurston County Emergency Preparedness to come out and do a 'training' of how we set up our MYN (map your neighborhood)

Emergency Kit Basics

- Two-week supply of bottled water
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Candles, holders and matches
- Battery-powered radio with fresh batteries
- Manual (non-electric) can opener
- One-week supply of baby formula, diapers, etc., if applicable
- Also be sure you have a neighbor or someone close by that you can team up with for help.
- Vacuum bottle to keep drinks hot
- Dry firewood, kindling and paper
- Extra blankets or sleeping bags
- One-week supply of non-perishable food
- Windup or battery-operated clock


